## 2023!!!

This year has indeed been an "INTERESTING" one!! Following MORE than two years of COVID and all its evil cousins, 2022 started with a huge NEGATIVE bang! The Omicron variant spread like wildfire to remind people that the disease is NOT ready to say "goodbye." As I write this in December of 2022, Hawaii lost 5 more to Omicron last week, with almost 1000 more cases! And, as if THAT wasn't enough, this year's flu season has been devastating for many, plus the emergence of the RSV virus!

On the world scene, aside from the continuing Omicron and flu/RSV scare, several significant events have created MORE fear and hatred! Russia's invasion of Ukraine, China's shutdown of its factories due to COVID, and Saudi Arabia's cut in oil production have ALL created worldwide shortages in food, tech, production, and commerce. "Normalcy" is slowly sinking in, and our classes have been doing VERY well. Today, 12/3, marks another milestone for HSK. We are having the return of our annual Christmas party!! In fact, this is our FIRST social

event since COVID hit three years ago!! I'm certainly looking forward to THIS one!!!

We have already held several belt promotion exams, with one scheduled for next Saturday, 12/10. Our beginners class has been working very hard since their first exam for yellow belt back in September, with their next exam for blue belt scheduled for mid-January of 2023.

As we wrap up 2022, I feel good about the prospects for 2023. After struggling to walk in heavy fog for 2 1/2 years, I can finally see the light at the end of the tunnel — and it brightens with each passing day!
